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SYLLABUS

MISSION STATEMENT

To equip leaders to fulfill the Great Commission and the Great Commandments through the local church and its ministries.

CORE VALUE:

Each academic year, a core value is emphasized. This year's core value is *Doctrinal Integrity*: Knowing that the Bible is the Word of God, we believe it, teach it, proclaim it, and submit to it. Our confessional commitments are outlined in the Articles of Faith and the Baptist Faith and Message.

NOBTS COURSE PURPOSE:

The purpose of this course is to carry out the mission of NOBTS as is reflected through the following core values and core competencies:

CORE COMPETENCIES:

Servant Leadership - Students will reflect on their role as servant leaders in facilitating worship in local congregations

Worship Leadership - Students will be challenged in learning to facilitate worship leadership more effectively through ministering through music to NOBTS students in chapel and the community through concerts at local churches

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

The Ladies Ensemble provides the opportunity for students, seminary family, and community friends to find enjoyment and fulfillment by singing in a choral unit. Striving for excellence in choral technique is one of the basic goals. Building rapport, blend, balance, intonation, pronunciation, etc., will be part of each rehearsal.

REHEARSALS:

Rehearsals for the Ladies Ensemble will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 12:45 to 1:45 in Sellers Recital Hall. All members of Ladies Ensemble must be able to faithfully attend both the Tuesday and Thursday full rehearsals. Students with LE scholarships are held to a higher expectation in both attendance and attitude.

MUSIC:

Each lady may furnish her own black, three-ring folder or check one out from the Music Division office. The division will furnish music.

EVALUATION:

Grades will be based on attendance, attitude, and work in each rehearsal and performance. Being a small ensemble, absences have greater effect: 0-3 absences=A; 4-7 absences = B; 8-11 please drop the class. Absences from chapel services and “road trip” performances constitute two absences each.

Everyone who desires to be in the ensemble and has basic musical talent and knowledge is welcome but prompt and regular attendance are expected from all, whether the class is being taken for credit, audit, or just “sitting in.” Participants must be able to attend both rehearsals in the week.

PERFORMANCES:

Performances will be announced as far ahead as possible to ease scheduling difficulties. Each semester, the Ensemble performs 2-3 times in chapel and takes a Sunday evening “road trip” to perform in area churches and other places of ministry such as retirement centers and nursing homes. Spring semester date will be provided in February. Our semester road trip to an area church (evening service) is usually in April in the Spring. Exact dates will be determined as the time gets closer and opportunity presents itself.

ATTIRE:

The group decides on proper attire. Usually some combination of black, white, and a splash of red somewhere is the normal performance dress. Sometimes we lapse into navy blue; in the second semester we sometimes get Spring fever and just go crazy with pastels. You never can tell with this bunch!
