**SYLLABUS**

**Mission Statement:**

The mission of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary is to equip leaders to fulfill the Great Commission and the Great Commandments through the local church and its ministries.

**Core Values: Focus and Curriculum Competencies:**

1. The Curriculum Competencies addressed will include Disciple Making and Servant Leadership.
2. The Core Values of the Seminary include:

Each school year one of the core values is highlighted. That annual Core value will be emphasized during the course.

**Course Description:**

This course is the second of 2 semester-long, pass-fail experiences in a faculty-mentored group. The group will meet for two hours bi-weekly for accountability, mentoring, discussion, and spiritual formation in the company of others. It will include specific assignments from a variety of Christian devotional practices. This course is designed to be taken immediately following DISC5170.

**Course Objectives:**

1. The learner will grow in his/her biblical understanding of spiritual maturation (i.e., what is often referred to as 'discipleship').
2. The learner will be challenged to develop a strong personal commitment to a discipling lifestyle (i.e. basic devotional practices).
3. The learner will develop skills in leading discipleship groups and consider such groups as part of the discipleship strategy of a local Church ministry.

### **Course Methodology:**

The professor will use dialog and discussion as the main vehicles of the mentoring process. There will be personal and group interchange between students and professor both in class and online. The emphasis is not on lecturing from professor but on student led participation in group discussions of materials of course.

### **Textbooks:**

Students are encouraged to explore the variety of resources useful for spiritual formation.

The following textbooks are required (will be used in assignments):

### **Course Requirements:**

The students are required to:

1. Maintain a Daily Bible Reading/Devotional plan for the semester. **Due Date: February 6, 2012.**
2. Write and submit **two** one half-page devotions based on two Bible verses or passage selections. **Due Date: March 5, 2012.**
3. Read the course textbooks and write two page reviews for each. **Due Date: April 30, 2012.**
4. Keep a Reflection Journal for each chapter of the textbooks. Use the study guides in the textbooks as a resource for the journal. **Submit the journal to the professor by April 30, 2012.**
5. Meet with a local “Spiritual” Friend/Mentor once a month for prayer and discussion of the student’s reflections in his/her journal. The student should share reflections at an appropriate level of comfort and confidentiality. List the name of the friend/mentor in the front of the journal.
6. Complete a final exam/reflection paper. **Due Date: April 30, 2012.**
7. The learner will complete all reflection and discussion activities on Blackboard.

### **Course Evaluation:**

The course is offered on a pass-fail basis. The student's final grade will be Determined as follows:

Scripture reading certification	20%
Two half-page devotions	20%
Journal on textbook chapters	20%
Blackboard participation	20%
Final exam/reflection paper	20%

### **Other Important Information:**

- 1. Assignments turned in past the due date will incur a late penalty of five points, which will be deducted from the assignment grade. Assignments will not be accepted more than one week past the due date without permission.**
- 2. Absences:** The maximum number of absences that can be taken without failure are three (3) classroom hours for an one hour course. (see Graduate Catalog, p. 142)
- 3. Meeting Places:** At the discretion of the professor the classes will meet in different places to experience different settings. Professor will email notifications of the meeting places in advance and will provide instructions for arrangements for all to participate.

# Do Not Delay!

## Immunization Form REQUIRED for you to proceed with Class Registration at UCF

Obtaining proof of immunizations may be a time-consuming process, so start now!

1. UCF will accept the official State of Florida Immunization form, issued by local health departments and physicians offices, in conjunction with completing this form. If you have this form, attach it to the UCF Immunization form you download from the UCF website and mail it to UCF Health Services, Attn: HIM Department, P.O. Box 163333, 4000 Central Florida Blvd., Orlando, FL 32816-3333
2. The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) has recommended that college freshman living in residence halls receive vaccinations for meningococcal meningitis. By action of the Florida State University System Board of Governors, this recommendation is supported by the policy effective July 1, 2008 that “all NEW matriculating students must provide documentation of vaccinations against meningococcal meningitis and hepatitis B or provide a signed waiver for each declined vaccination.”
