AAR International Dissertation Research Grants Program

The International Dissertation Research Grants Program is designed to support AAR student members whose dissertation research requires them to travel outside of the country in which their school or university is located. Grants are intended to help candidates complete their doctoral degrees by offsetting costs of travel, lodging, and other dissertation research-related expenses. Two \$5,000 grants will be given for the 2010-2011 academic year. To be eligible, applicants must have been AAR student members for at least 2 years and must have completed all doctoral requirements for the doctoral degree except the dissertation. Applicants must submit a letter of application that describes their research project and how support for on-site research is critical for the completion of their dissertation; current curriculum vitae; proposed budget and project timeline; and letter of support from their dissertation supervisor. National Fellowship Foundation

The [Charlotte W. Newcombe Doctoral Dissertation Fellowships](#) support the final year of dissertation work for Ph.D. candidates in the humanities and social sciences. Eligible proposals have religious or ethical values as a central concern and are relevant to the solution of contemporary religious, cultural, or human rights questions. The stipend for this year will be \$25,000 for a twelve-month period of dissertation writing. The proposal submission deadline is **November 15, 2010**.

**2011-2012 Educational Testing Service Fellowship and Internship Programs
in Research and Development**

The goal of the ETS R&D Fellowship and Internship programs is to promote quality and distinction in educational measurement and related fields through support of significant research and exposure to methodologies within the ETS environment. These programs provide opportunities for talented scholars and students from diverse backgrounds and encourages research in areas such as psychometrics, cognitive psychology, statistics, teaching and classroom research, and learning theory. **2011-2012 National Academy of Education/Spencer
Postdoctoral Fellowship in Education Research**

The National Academy of Education/Spencer Postdoctoral Fellowship program supports early-career scholars working in critical areas of educational scholarship. Fellows receive \$55,000 for one academic year of research, or \$27,500 for each of two contiguous years, working half time. Applicants must have had their PhD, EdD, or equivalent research degree conferred between January 1, 2005 and December 31, 2010. Applicants from all disciplines are encouraged.
