Summer/Fall Directed Study Proposals

If you would like to do a directed study this summer or fall and have not contacted the ReDOC office for guidelines concerning preparation and chain of approval, please do so as soon as possible. In order to have a directed study proposal for summer considered by ReDOC at their **March 2** meeting, 11 copies of the proposal must be submitted to the ReDOC office by **February 23**. If you are planning to submit a directed study proposal for fall, you must submit 11 copies to the ReDOC office by **April 27** for the **May 4** meeting.


your doctoral guidance committee after you make any revisions your committee deems appropriate in light of feedback from ReDOC.
