By this date, a Research Proposal Report form indicating approval and 2 copies of the finalized document must be received by the ReDOC office. RDOC9303 Prospectus Development will be held **June 6-10**. Students with approved proposals should register for this course online under the Summer Miniterm in addition to registering for the fall semester.

Biola University's Center for Christian Thought Fellowship Announcement

Biola University's Center for Christian Thought, which officially launches spring 2012, will be granting four external fellowships. The theme of the research will be **"Christian Scholarship in the 21st Century: Prospects and Perils."** Fellowship recipients will be in residence at Biola University from **January 29, 2012 to May 19, 2012**. A two-week seminar at the start of the term will be led by visiting scholars Nicholas Wolterstorff and Alvin Plantinga, who will return at the end of the semester to participate in a two-day conference that discusses the fellows' research.

Applications for this fellowship must be submitted by **May 15, 2011**. Applications should include a curriculum vitae, name and contact information of three references familiar with applicant's scholarly work, and a research proposal of no more than 1,200 words describing the applicant's proposed project. Applicants must have a PhD or equivalent terminal degree. External Research Fellows will receive a \$25,000 stipend, office space, and a research assistant. Funds will also be available to offset relocation expenses. Awards will be announced **June 15, 2011**.
