Course Description

This seminar will involve studying and examining the biblical leadership principles and styles of leadership in the Old Testament and New Testament. Students will determine the theological implications and leadership principles foundational for effective Christian leadership.

Student Learning Outcomes

At the conclusion of this course, each student should be able to:

1. Identify the biblical leadership principles and styles of leadership in the Old and New Testaments.
2. Assess key competencies and theological implications of biblical leadership.
3. Interpret contemporary leadership theories through the lens of biblical leaders.
4. Analyze their ministry setting and determine the most effective Christian leadership competencies.

Course Teaching Methodology

1. The primary course method will involve student research and the reporting of that research in papers and seminar presentations.
2. Lectures and small-group dialogue will be utilized to enhance and promote personal assimilation and integration of course concepts and content.
3. Student interaction with peers, pastoral ministry resource persons, seminary faculty members, and the seminar professor are encouraged during the duration of this seminar to facilitate insights and develop competencies.

Course Requirements

Assignment #1: Old Testament Leadership Principles/Competencies: Presentation

Extrapolate and synthesize five (5) Old Testament Leadership Principles and/or Competencies, utilizing the required readings. For EACH principle/competency, discuss one OT leader as a case study. For EACH principle/competency, discuss the theological implication. The presentation should be interactive in nature reflecting the scope/content of all required readings. The OT Leadership presentation is to be submitted to the professors through Blackboard 24 hours prior to the first seminar meeting. Following Seminar Session 1 students will be asked to post their presentations in the Discussion Board on Blackboard for access by other students.

Assignment #2: New Testament Leadership Principles/Competencies: Presentation

Extrapolate and synthesize five (5) New Testament Leadership Principles and/or Competencies, utilizing the required readings. For EACH principle/competency, discuss one NT leader as a case study. For EACH principle/competency, discuss the theological implication. The presentation should be interactive in nature reflecting the scope/content of all required readings. The NT Leadership presentation is to be submitted to the professors through Blackboard 24 hours prior to the first seminar meeting. Following Seminar Session 2 students will be asked to post their presentations in the Discussion Board on Blackboard for access by other students.

Assignment #3: Biblical and Theological Basis: Research Paper

Students will compose a 30-35 page Biblical and Theological Basis Research Paper on one of the topics listed below. Students are to submit to Dr. Ogea via email their first and second choices from the list and Dr. Ogea will assign the topic on the order in which the emails were received.

Students will be assigned a presentation time in either the third or fourth seminar meeting. Students will post their papers in **BlackBoard** two days prior to the seminar meeting assigned for the presentation. The seminar presentation of the selected research should be creative and not a recitation of the paper (the paper will already have been read). Seek to involve the seminar participants in a meaningful dialogue and discussion. The presentation and discussion should last no longer than 30-40 minutes and then followed by peer/professor evaluation. Peer evaluators will be assigned for each paper and presentation to evaluate documents for content, writing and formatting. The assessment rubric (google forms) will be available through BB and should be completed prior to seminar attendance

Assignment #4: Biblical and Theological Foundations Reflection Paper

At the conclusion of the seminar students will write a reflection paper (3-5 pages) detailing the acquisition, application and appreciation of the subject matter under consideration in this class. The Reflection Paper should also address the challenges and surprises encountered by the student in the seminar. First person is permitted for this assignment only.
