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Seminary Mission Statement

The mission of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary is to equip leaders to fulfill the Great Commission and the Great Commandments through the local church and its ministries.

Course Description

The seminar introduces students to theological, biblical, philosophical, and methodological issues related to contemporary Historical Jesus research. Issues addressed include the nature of the task, the role of the historian, tools for the task, as well as past and contemporary personalities in Historical Jesus research. The seminar will emphasize personal reading, research, and writing.

Objectives

1. Students will demonstrate familiarity with issues related to Jesus research by: (1) reading broadly on the history of Jesus research and (2) writing reports on assigned readings in the field and leading the seminar in discussion of issues related to their reading.
2. Students will demonstrate basic familiarity with the variety of methods used in Jesus research by writing reports on assigned readings over sources and methods in Jesus research and leading the seminar in discussion of issues related to their reading. Students will also submit a book review for each volume of Meier's work at the end of the semester.
3. Students will demonstrate basic familiarity with significant personalities involved in contemporary Jesus research by: (1) writing a research paper summarizing and critiquing a contemporary Jesus scholar or a particular issue in Jesus research; and (2) writing formal responses to the papers of other students.
4. Students will formalize and express their own conclusions on Jesus research by writing personal perspectives on Jesus research.

Core Values Addressed

The course will address the core values of *Doctrinal Integrity*, *Characteristic Excellence*, and *Mission Focus* most directly. Reflection on a core Christian doctrine—Christology—is central to the course. Special attention is given to clear thinking and critical reflection on the nature of

history and the task of the historian—something that is a must for academic *excellence* in this field of study. Students in the course will be called upon to work in several disciplines in order to critique and construct a view of the historical Jesus, again leading to academic excellence. *Spiritual Vitality* is also in view in that the study of Jesus is ultimately undertaken in order to know Jesus Christ more fully.

Methodology

The seminar will utilize reading assignments, written reading reports, class discussion of the reading, a research paper, a formal response to another student's paper, and personal perspectives. The professor will also provide a critique of each paper individually for each student. Students will be expected to revise their papers accordingly. The primary methodology will be individual research and writing, guided by the professor.

Grading

Grades will be assigned on the basis of the NOBTS grading scale.
