Course Purpose, Core Value Focus, and Curriculum Competencies

New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary has five core values: Doctrinal Integrity, Spiritual Vitality, Mission Focus, Characteristic Excellence, and Servant Leadership. This course addresses Doctrinal Integrity, the focus core value for this year, in that it enhances the student’s ability to interpret the Bible accurately. Characteristic Excellence is addressed in that the student should exhibit excellence in the ability to interpret Scripture. Servant Leadership is modeled in classroom demeanor. This course primarily addresses the competency of Biblical Exposition by preparing the student to interpret and communicate the Bible accurately.

Course Description

This seminar is designed for intensive exegetical work in the Book of Isaiah. Attention is given to the issues of background, history of interpretation, language, authorship, literary nature, and other critical problems as well as theology of the book.

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, the student will have:

1. Gained a mastery of the historical background of Isaiah.
2. Become familiar with the history of interpretation and current status of the study of Isaiah.
3. Translated significant portions of Isaiah from the Hebrew.
4. Explored the major themes of the Book of Isaiah.
5. Analyzed the theological aspects of Isaiah to discern the relevance of the book for ministry.

Course Teaching Methodology

The methodologies for the seminar include:

1. The professor will employ the lecture method to introduce the seminar.
2. The student will prepare and present critical reviews of books and articles related to critical issues of Isaiah.
3. The student will discuss pertinent issues such as authorship, historical setting, and theological teachings of the book.
4. The student will prepare and present background studies related to critical issues in Isaiah.
5. The student will translate, outline, and analyze an assigned portion of Isaiah.
6. The student will prepare and present a seminar paper related to Isaiah.
