CURRICULUM COMPETENCIES ADDRESSED

Spiritual and Character Development

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a 2 semester-long, pass-fail experiences in a faculty-mentored group. The group will meet an hour weekly for accountability, mentoring, discussion, and spiritual formation in the company of others. It will include specific assignments from a variety of Christian devotional practices. This course is designed to be taken during a student's first Fall semester.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. The learner will grow in his/her biblical understanding of spiritual maturation (i.e., what is often referred to as 'discipleship').
2. The learner will be challenged to develop a strong personal commitment to a discipling lifestyle.
3. The learner will develop skills in leading discipleship groups and consider such groups as a part of the discipleship strategy of a local church ministry.

COURSE TEACHING METHODOLOGIES

Methodology will include but is not limited to student presentations, class/group discussions, faculty dialogue, and intense periods of personal preparation through the accountable exercising of spiritual habits, practices, and disciplines.

Course Requirements:

1. Keep a journal of his or her spiritual journey throughout the course.
2. Participate in all class discussions and meetings.
3. Read the assigned readings and lead a class discussion of one chapter (as assigned by the professor).
4. Lead one devotional period in class.

Course Evaluation:

The course is offered on a pass-fail basis as follows:

Absences and Late Assignments

In accordance with seminary policy, a student will automatically **fail the course** if he or she incurs three absences. When emergencies exist, the student may petition the academic advisor for permission to remain in class with excessive absences. Being late to class three times equates to an absence. Moreover, students, **not the instructor or grader**, are responsible for having their presence in class recorded on the class roll when they are tardy in attendance.

Assignments turned in past the due date are not acceptable.

- Leading Others in Spiritual Formation

Assignments are due at the beginning of the class period. Exact dates will be negotiated during the first class session.

Blackboard Course Enrollment

The following are the student enrollment instructions for Blackboard:

1. Open your web browser to the seminary home page at <http://www.nobts.edu>

2. Click on the **Blackboard** link in the left-hand column. **(If you already have a Blackboard account, log in and skip to step 6. You need only one Blackboard account.)**
3. When the new page opens, choose the **Create Account** button on the left.
4. Enter in your information. (Note: Fields with a red asterisk are required fields). When finished entering your information, click **Submit**.
5. When the next page loads, confirming your registration, click **OK**.
6. Now, your personal Blackboard home page should appear. To enroll in a class, click on the **Courses** tab at the top of the page.
7. Click the **Browse Course Catalog** link on the right-hand side of the page.
8. You will see all courses for which you can register. Scroll down the page and choose to register for **Spiritual Formation** by clicking on the **Enroll** button beside the course's name.
9. Enter the access code provided by the Professor. The code is **iamatheologian**. (Note: The access code is case sensitive).
10. Click **OK** when the confirmation page appears.
