Course Description, Teaching Methodology, and Curriculum Competencies

This colloquium is designed to direct Ph.D. students majoring in Christian Leadership to explore foundational readings and literary resources related to significant developments which have shaped the field of leadership.

Student Learning Outcomes

At the conclusion of this colloquium, students will:

1. Be able to identify foundational works which have shaped the field of Christian leadership.
2. Be able to list significant historical developments in field of Christian leadership.\
3. Value the contribution of key leadership developments to the advancement of Christian leadership.
4. Demonstrate acceptable knowledge of significant leadership developments in their doctoral qualifying and oral exams.

Assignments and Evaluation Criteria

1. An **Executive Summary** of the *Reviewing Leadership* textbook. An Executive Summary is a short document which summarizes a book in such a way that readers can become rapidly acquainted with it without having to read it all. The Executive Summary will consist of a one-page synthesis of EACH chapter (8 chapters) in the book, including the following components:
 - a. A three-paragraph summation of the chapter contents.
 - b. A two-paragraph discussion of the Value of the chapter topic for the field of Christian Leadership.
 - c. Select three (3) key insights from the chapter and give a one-paragraph discussion (for each insight) of their application to contemporary Christian leadership.

Format for the Executive Summary: Single-spaced, no paragraph indentions, a double space between paragraph, headings/subheadings, pagination, and cover page according to Turabian, references and/or quotes indicated by endnotes instead of footnotes.

2. An **Annotated Bibliography** of significant books and dissertations (PhD and/or DMin) which have shaped the field of Christian leadership development. Students preparing for their doctoral qualifying exam must list thirty (30) entries in correct Turabian format. Students preparing for their doctoral oral exam must list forty (40) entries in correct Turabian format. The Annotated Bibliography must contain at least 5, but no more than 10 dissertation entries. Maximum length of annotations – two paragraphs (200 words). Format: Annotations should list the bibliographic entry, followed by single-spaced paragraphs, double-spaced between the annotations.
3. An **Annotated Bibliography** of twenty journal articles which address the field of Christian leadership development. Five (5) of the annotated articles are to be selected from the *Journal of Biblical Perspectives in Leadership*. The remaining fifteen (15) articles may be selected from the EBSCOhost and/or ATLA database search in the NOBTS Library, and must involve at least five different professional Journals. Maximum length of annotations – two paragraphs (200 words). Format: same as Assignment #2.
4. An **Annotated List** of ten (10) Fields of Research that must be studied in order to analyze the historical development of Christian leadership. Each annotation should address the significance (importance) of the field related to the historical development of Christian leadership – past, present, and future. Each of the Fields of Research annotations should be at least three-paragraphs, but no more than one page per annotation. Format: same as Assignment #1.

Evaluation for Grading:

The assignments will be weighted according to perception of the professor in regard to the overall quality of the student's work.

The colloquium will utilize **BLACKBOARD**. Assignments are to be uploaded in the Assignment section no later than 8 am on the due date. Assignments 2, 3 & 4 should also be uploaded into a Discussion Board section for sharing with the other colloquium participants.

Schedule of Colloquium Sessions (Times listed CST)

This colloquium will be taught in a non-traditional format. Because the colloquium will only meet four times during the semester, students should take careful note of the assignments and the corresponding due dates. Students must attend every session of the colloquium and be prepared to discuss the corresponding assignments. All Assignments are to be uploaded in BLACKBOARD, no later than 8 a.m. on the date assigned.
